- ii. Pride Alliance-Meets every other week. Host socials and "out week." Way to engage with LGBTQIA on campus. Then march in the pride parade.
- iii. oStem-Georgia Tech chapter of a national organization. Bring in different organizations who want to recruit our students. Hosts one event a month.
- iv. Pride Graduate Student Group- Student organized- do mostly socials, potlucks, hiking, drinking, etc. Not very structured.
- v. Counseling Center-Individual and group counseling. If students do not seem to need therapy, send to resource center first.

 - ii. Register for SafeSpace training & trans101
 - iii. Put your pronouns in your email signature and on your business cards (sign of respect to all students, and can also show allyship).
 - iv. Introduce yourself with pronouns and make them a standard practice in meetings
 - v. Respect students' chosen names and use these in all correspondence
 - vi. Sign up for the Center's newsletter, like us on Facebook, follow us on Twitter
 - vii. Attend the Center's events
 - viii. Have questions that you don't feel comfortable asking in-person? Go to the website and click on "Ask Aby"

- Currently no classes or special topics courses, but hoping to have a section within a future Diversity & Inclusion section of GT 1000.
- Interaction with faculty have been fairly positive; there have been a few misunderstandings specifically around transgender; Common concerns from students are whether or not it's safe to be themselves on campus with faculty & staff (will they respect me?)
- Question: Is it okay or how can I appropriate talk to a student who is transitioning and I notice it? Answer: Be proactive in the general for all students like pronouns, trainings. But also, if the student feels comfortable then they will tell you.
- Question: How many trans students are on campus? We don't have a real way
 to know unless they self-identify and we do not collect data. But currently in T+
 we have 28 identified students, and roughly 6-12 students who have not been a
 part of the T+ community.
